We are pleased to continue the Chess Coaching Programme at our school and look forward to bringing the excitement, competition and educational benefits of chess to your children. Sessions start with a formal lesson; all players will learn a new strategy, idea or skill each week. Then they put those skills into practice with activities and games. All games are monitored and supervised by the coach who provides individual feedback along the way. We reward those that do well and encourage and support those that are struggling. 

Messages to School

Please don't send messages to school via your children. It is easier for them if you contact the office or teacher directly. Thank you.



Please read the following notice and pay careful attention to the details. If we continue to have issues with parking we may lose the privileges we have of being able to use these car parks and driveways. We understand that there are difficult circumstances at both the Great North Road and St Georges Rd entrances with builders and road works but we would appreciate your reading the following and complying with the instructions please:

- If you use the Great North Road entrance to pick up and drop off your child please only use the 2130 driveway and not the driveway at the other end of the car park area. This is a private driveway and is not ours to use.
- If you use the St Georges Road entrance parents are to park on the road and walk your child/ren safely down the
 path to the school. You may use the circular driveway in front of the church to drop off only but you must be aware
 of busses and children walking. The car park is reserved for Kindergarten parents and for those attending weekly
 church activities with a limited number of car parks being available to staff and visitors.
- The Kelvinside entrance will be open from Monday but you must park on the road and walk your children to the gate. There will be a staff member on duty at the gate. We have had complaints regarding both of these areas and would appreciate your co-operation.
