Dear parents

I am a strong believer in the concept of community, as the family of God. This extends to all believers all over the world and in different contexts. Christian community is where God's people are, whether it be in church, one's neighbourhood or a place of learning. Genuine Christian community is a powerful, unified, love driven force extending the Kingdom of God on earth.

Real community, although often spoken about, is under siege in the 21st century with the prevailing _ prevalence of individualism. Community is often reduced to the coming together of a group of people with common interests. This is more of a social organisation, rather than community. Many schools are social organisations. It is our desire to see so much more in JCS as a Christ centred community of _ learning, where community is experienced in the real sense of the word. A place where we regard each other as the family of God with the common goal of glorifying God in all we do. This needs to be modelled to our children so that they not only know the scriptures and the way we should live as Christ followers in God's world but that they see what this looks like as we all live each day as authentic disciples. We are about

so much more than providing a service of education. As Christian educators we are about nurturing and raising up young people to love the Lord their God with all their heart, soul mind and strength and so become change agents in the world for the kingdom of God.

A helpful definition for community is; a unified human organism with a distinct identity characterised by a shared life in which all its members participate. We are a community of diverse cultures and churches, yet we have a common interest, purpose and will in wanting Christian education for our children. This results in commitment. We have the unity of a shared communal identity as the family of God. We strive to pray for and support one another, celebrate and mourn together. When one of our members is in need we provide help, we act in the interests of one another and look to bless each other's children. I heard it said once said that to embrace the gospel is to enter into community. For Christians the wellbeing and thriving of others is a core value. A communal structure is the structure of a living organism governed by the relationships of its members. Relationships of trust, kindness, goodwill and the desire to fulfil a common goal are building blocks for community. Genuine community is paramount to success.

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As diverse people, in community, it is vital that God's word and not the will of the members form the framework for what makes the structure distinctive. Even within the realms of Christians there are varying opinions and ideas. With God's Word as our authority and the desire to love our brother, we walk in truth. As a school our main business is teaching and learning. The shared beliefs of Christian education make us a distinctive community. It is a privilege to part of God's community in this place and to honour one another as precious members of the Body of Christ. What a powerful example this is for our children to emulate.
